5. To strengthen and support the Church: one's own parish community and parish priests, the worldwide Church and the Holy Father.
6. To do Penance, including abstaining from meat and fasting from food on the appointed days.
7. To join the missionary spirit and the apostolate for the Church.

Every year each council is required to file certain reports to the Supreme Council on its activities. One such report is the survey of fraternal activity. We recently filed

During 1996, we had over 100 blood donors. You volunteered thousands of hours of service to aid the Church, the community and youth. 
