Local Person Honored For Achievement

Harold A. This Card **MUST** be presented by a family member whose badge number is listed on the card, and is old enough to register a guest. The card has spaces to punch a hole in to record each guest privilege used during the month. **PLEASE NOTE THAT ALTHOUGH MORE THAN SIX SPACES PER MONTH HAVE BEEN PROVIDED THE NEW RULES ALLOW ONLY SIX GUEST PRIVILEGES PER MONTH.** The Rules also state that "All Privileges for the month in which a card was lost will be forfeited."

Please remember that the original idea for a Knights of Columbus, Columbian Swim Club was to provide a place for our Brother Knights and their families to share a facility together in the spirit of Columbianism. Scholarship

The Scholarship Committee is announcing the availability of a \$500.00 scholarship per year to a boy or girl who wishes to pursue a Catholic High School education or to anyone already enrolled in a Catholic High School. In order to be eligible, the following criteria must be met.

1. He or she must be a child, brother or sister of a deceased member or a member in good standing of Union Council #4504. Dues must be paid through June 1979.

2. The applicant must pass the Archdiocesan High School Exam and be accepted by a Catholic High School.

Preference for the scholarship will be decided by the Scholarship Committee on the basis of financial need and scholastic ability.

The recipient of the scholarship will be awarded an additional \$500.00 each year upon proof of satisfactory fulfillment of the scholarship requirements of the high school. The maximum award will be \$2,000.00 payable in increments of \$500.00 per year.

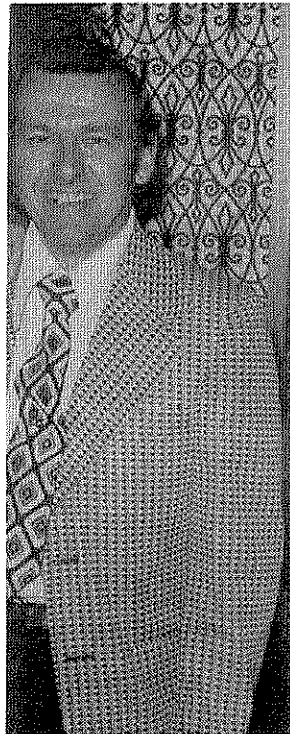
Knight of the Month For June

Memories

On January 19, 1959 a special meeting was held to formally present Union Council with its charter, officially designating it as a member of the Supreme Council K of C. The meeting was opened by Howard Leary, our Charter Grand Knight, with a prayer and salute to the flag as usual, followed by introduction of visiting officers, guest speakers and other visitors.

District Deputy Frank Jackiewicz presented the charter on behalf of the Supreme Council with Grand Knight Howard Leary accepting on behalf of the Council. The organization date of December 2, 1957 was noted on the charter and a list of charter members was included. Speakers during the course of the evening included Past State Deputy Daniel McCormick, District Deputy George D. Leary and Stanley Heller both of Carroll Council, Union City, District Deputy Frank Jackiewicz, Mayor F. Edward Biertuempfel and Chaplain Rev. Father Joseph Driscoll.

Awards were presented by G. K. Howard Leary to D. D. Frank Jackiewicz and D. D. George Leary, brother of our Grand Knight, for their efforts in organizing Union Council. Guests present at the affair were G. K. Charles Mc Ginley and D.G.K. Arthur Carroll of Elizabeth Council #253 and George Gerting, G. K. of Father Canty Council #3197 in Hillside.

Entertainment was provided by the Fun Addics, a barber shop quartet from Summit followed by a roast beef buffet. The meeting which was attended by 250 members was concluded at 9:30 with a prayer led by our beloved Chaplain Father Joseph Driscoll.

A Question of Heart

Imagine yourself having dinner one evening at a posh new restaurant, when suddenly the man sitting next to you clutches at his throat, starts coughing and begins turning blue. What would you do?

Imagine yourself at the pool when suddenly there is a commotion and your son, or a friend's son is dragged out of the water; his breathing, his heart, stopped. What would you do?

Imagine yourself having just finished mowing the lawn, coming into the kitchen for a cool drink, when suddenly you feel a heavy pressure in your chest. As you collapse on the floor you see your wife's face. What will she do?

In all the situations mentioned above, you, or a member of your family can be of help. By using the techniques incorporated in Cardio-Pulmonary-Resuscitation (C.P.R.), you can clear the airway, administer mouth to mouth resuscitation and begin external heart massage. These techniques can often spell the difference between life and death; between being able to help or just standing idly by.

As a service to the Union Council, a special "Heart Saver" course is soon to be made available to the brothers and their families (participants must be over 18). The techniques taught in this course will include those already mentioned and, in addition, teach under what set of circumstances to administer C.P.R. This course will be given by personnel of Memorial General Hospital, right here in the Council, on two weekday evenings, coming this Spring.
