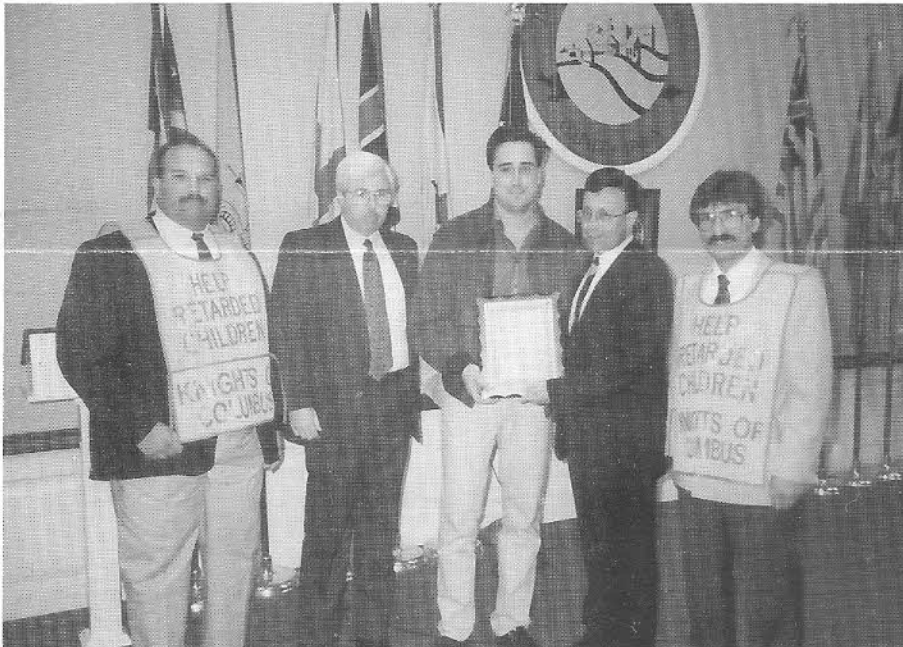

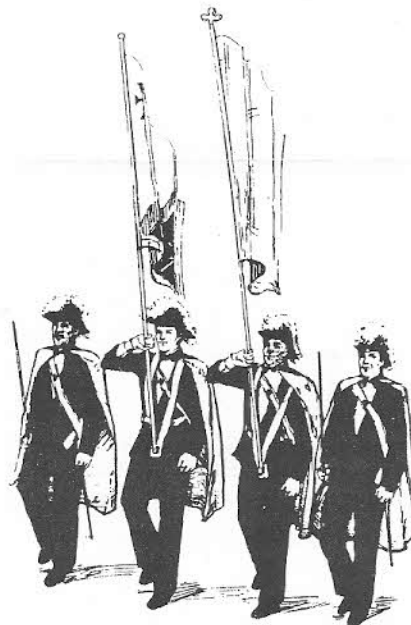

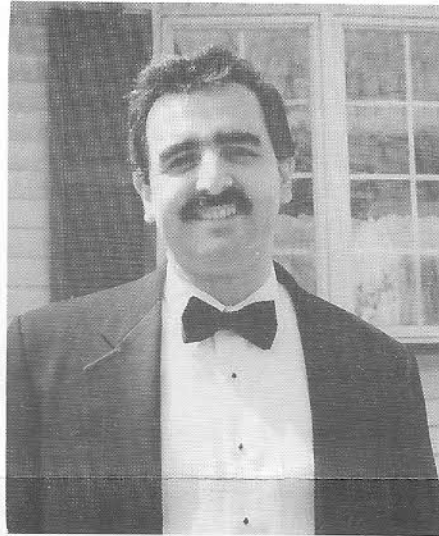

## Chaplain's Column

As we are all aware, we have just completed the season of Lent culminating in the three holiest of days, Holy Thursday, Good Friday and Easter Sunday. Our church was filled at these services and that was heartening. But it was not just the numbers. I sensed a faith-filled, joy in the Lord spirituality that was truly uplifting. One of the most moving parts of these days for me was the Reposition of the Blessed Sacrament on Holy Thursday after the Mass of the Lord's Supper. People stayed and prayed and placed their cares in the hands of the Lord. From all over they came. By busloads and vans, by cars and on foot they came. Reverence and awe permeated our church. Some people sang, some prayed aloud together, but most were just there with the Lord quietly. Cardinal Newman described this kind of communication with the Lord as "cor ad cor loquitur," speaking heart to heart. As I watched and felt the faith of these people, my own faith was strengthened. And as the last person left at Midnight and I put the Lord back from his place of repose I was again reminded of the words of the psalmist: "What return can I make to the Lord for all that He has given me?"

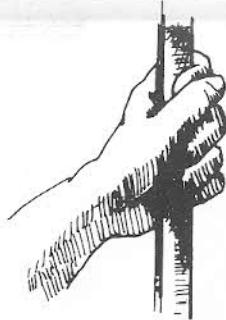
## MEMORARE
