Brother Knight Patrick Scanlon has been a resident of Union for 12 years. He and his wife Deborah have three children: Tammy, age 26, Lisa, age 24, and P.J., age 14. They also have a grandchild, Casey, who is 4 years old. Pat and his family are parishioners of Saint Michael's church where Pat serves as a lector.

Pat attended Saint Benedict's Preparatory School where he graduated with honors. He is a graduate of Saint Peter's College with a major in political science/ American history. He also holds advanced degrees from Seton Hall, Essex County College and Kean College.

Upon graduation from St. Peter's in 1974, he began his career with the Essex County Department of Public Safety as a correction officer. In later years, other assignments included legislative research analyst and coordinator of the Law Enforcement Division. He also worked for Union Hospital first as counselor, then coordinator, and finally, as director in the drug and alcohol recovery unit.
