

Chaplain's Column Rev. Edward Gedrich

I recently saw the musical "West Side Story" at the Paper Mill Playhouse, and I've been haunted by one of its familiar songs ever since.

"West Side Story", set in New York in the fifties, is of course based on Romeo and Juliet, with Tony and Maria, an Anglo and Puerto Rican, now the star-crossed lovers. Immersed in a society dominated by prejudice, they dream of a "somewhere" where they can freely, truly love: "There's a place for us, somewhere"

Don't we all dream of that somewhere, a place beyond suffering and disappointment, a place beyond sorrrow and tears? For we know that in this world all too often our dreams don't come true, our hopes are shattered by cold reality, by tragedy, by death. Where is that somewhere?

Christians call it heaven, that land where all is made new, where God "shall wipe every tear from their eyes, and there shall be no more death or mourning, crying out or pain, for the former world has passed away" (Rev. 21:4). Maybe we take heaven for granted. From the time we are little children we are told stories of heaven and so come to see it as the natural end of our lives in this world: we lose sight of the miracle that heaven is!

This month of November, the month in which the Church traditionally remembers those who have died, let us not fail to give thanks to God for the miracle we most take for granted: that there should be "a place for us" when our life is ended, a place filled with fullness — of healing, of joy, of life, a place where, one day, we shall joyfully greet our loved ones again when the love of Christ, which conquers all things, destroys even death itself.
