

"Jesus loves me, this I know, for the Bible tells me so!

Most of us, I'm sure, are familiar with this opening verse of an old Sunday School hymn. The bible indeed tells us the story of God's love as shown to us in the life of Jesus: how He walked this world's dusty roads, how He taught, and prayed, and healed, and wept, how He suffered and died, and rose from the dead, all out of love for us. The words of the Bible do indeed eloquently witness and testify to the love of Jesus for us.

But the words of that witness would fall on deaf ears were it not for another witness to God's love. That other witness is our own lives. We believe the words of the Bible about the Lord's love because we have experienced that love ourselves, in the triumphs and trials and tragedies of our own lives. Think of how much we--indeed, think of how much you--have survived: days of mourning and loss, darkness and sadness and at the death of loved one: accidents and sickness afflicting body, mind, and spirit: betrayals by and disappointment in loved ones you thought you could count on: the times that you yourself betrayed your own hopes and dreams through sin or foolishness. All the destructive events that should have destroyed us but didn't -because there was One by our side to bear us up and bring us through, our Crucified and Risen Lord, faithful in blessing and affliction. How much He has brought us through! What great things are yet possible because He is by our side.

Jesus loves me, this I know, for my own life has told me so!

May the blessing of the Risen Lord be yours!
