#### MESSAGE FROM THE GRAND KNIGHT



Brothers All,

We enter the last 30 days of our Columbian Year, and I take this moment to reflect. Our Council has gone through quite a few challenges and changes over this past year. Supreme and State has made multiple changes to the membership such as the Color Corp's Uniform, Online Membership, Separation of Council & Home Corporation Insurance and now an increase in NJ State's pro capita. We, as a Council, certainly have been through our fair share of trials and tribulations, but we have banded together in a way I did not think possible and we continue to strive forward.

There are only four (4) awards a Council can receive, and we are easily on track for three (3) of those. Union 4504 had an Admission Degree on 05/23/2018, with seven (7) new Brothers joining our Order and Council. I am incredibly happy to announce that we have satisfied our criteria for the Father McGivney Membership Award. As the largest Council in the state, our criteria is also the highest, at 35 new members not including transfer in's or online members. We are also on track on receiving the Columbian Award for Charitable Activities and the newly created Domestic Church Award. The only award we are shy on is the Founder's Award for Insurance. Just like our Membership award, we have the highest quota in the state, at 18 new insurance contracts. Currently, we are + 6. To my knowledge, the last time Union 4504 received all the awards was back in the year 1982. New first year members can start an annuity with as little as one \$100 payment, and Brothers in the Order for over a year can start the same with as little as \$300.

The Columbian Swim Club is now open, and we are ready for the next four months of gorgeous weather. We have fantastic summer events coming up. On Father Day, 4504 will be hosting an Affirmation of Wedding Vows Breakfast. This is a new program the Council wishes to do in order to support and preserve the wonders of marriage. 


## **Knight of the Month**



## Yellow Ribbon Ceremony

As is customary each time a member of their Knights family deploys overseas, the JFK Assembly 0666 along with Union Council 4504 held a Yellow Ribbon Ceremony on Saturday in honor of US Army Sgt. Erik Santiago.

For the past ten years, it has been a practice to put a yellow ribbon around a tree anytime a Brother Knight or a family member is deployed overseas. "The JFK Assembly does this as a reminder to their members that one of their Knights family is deployed overseas and to keep them in their prayers and thoughts until their safe return home," said Steve Nagy, Union Knights of Columbus / JFK Assembly Fourth Degree 0666.

Sgt. Santiago's father Jose is both a Sir Knight with the JFK Fourth Degree Assembly 0666 and a Brother Knight at the Union Council 4504.

This is not Sgt. Santiago's first "Yellow Ribbon". This deployment to Iraq will be his seventh, with previous deployments to South Korea, Kuwait, two to Afghanistan and two to Iraq.

Sgt. Santiago's father Jose and his uncle Felix did the ribbon reveal since Sgt. Santiago is now over in Iraq.

Msgr. Anselm Nwaorgu from St. Michael's Church the Council's Chaplain, blessed the ribbon and offered up blessings and prayers for Erik's safe return home next January. "The Knights look forward to his safe return home and his coming and cutting his ribbon off," said Nagy.

## Pope: Heaven is not boring!

Pope Francis said that Heaven cannot be boring as some people might imagine it, because it will be an encounter with Jesus, who is awaiting our arrival by praying for us.

The pope drew from the First Reading of the Mass taken from the Acts of the Apostles, when Paul tells the Jews how the inhabitants of Jerusalem and their religious leaders had not recognized Jesus and had condemned him to death, but he was raised from the dead.

Paul, said Pope Francis, calls Jesus' resurrection the fulfillment of God's Promise. The people of God trusted in the promise, because they knew God is faithful, he said.

We, too, are in movement along the path. When asked where we are heading, we say, 'Towards heaven!' 'So what's heaven?' some ask. There we begin to be unsure in our response. We don't know how best to explain heaven. Often we picture an abstract and distant heaven And some think: 'But won't it be boring there for all eternity?' No! That is not heaven. We are on the path towards an encounter: the final meeting with Jesus. Heaven is the encounter with Jesus.

Jesus prays for us

Pope Francis said we must often recall this idea: I am traveling in life to meet Jesus. This meeting will make us happy forever, he said.

But what does Jesus do in the meantime? the pope asked. As John's Gospel points out, he said, Jesus is working for us and praying for us. Pope Francis recalled Jesus' words at the Last Supper, when he promises Peter he will pray for him.

Each of us must say: 'Jesus is praying for me, working to prepare me a place.' He is faithful. He does so because he has promised it. Heaven will be this encounter, this meeting with the Lord who went ahead to prepare a place for each of us. This increases our faith.

May the Lord give us the awareness of walking along a path with this promise. May the Lord give us the grace to look upwards toward heaven and think: 'The Lord is praying for me.' -Aleteia | Apr 27, 2018
