The Patio Area, Snack Bar, Patio Bar and the Picnic Area are for the benefit of ALL members of Union Council 4504 and their families. These areas are the direct responsibility of the Columbian Club. Since March, Council members have been giving up their time and talents every week to make these areas a showplace and not a source of embarrassment. In order to keep these areas aesthetic and safe, your cooperation is imperative! We are taking this opportunity to remind you of some of the rules and regulations.

- 1. NO ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES are to be brought on or off the Patio Area, Picnic Area, Clubhouse, etc.
- 2. The lavorities, Patio and Picnic areas are cleaned each morning. During the day it is a cooperative effort to keep them clean.
- 3. A parent/guardian must be on Columbian Club premises at all times with children under the age of 12. A parent/guardian must supervise their child(ren) under the age of 16 after 6 P.M. After 9 P.M. NO CHILDREN 16 years of age or younger are allowed in the Picnic or Patio Areas (for safety reasons)
- 4. Please respect the privacy and property of our neighbors.
- 5. The cost of any property damage (especially for vandalism) will be charged to the responsible member.
- Bicycles and mopeds must be parked in designated areas. There is no bicycle, moped riding, skateboard or rollerblading in the Patio or Picnic Areas.
- 7. Parking is restricted to the free, public parking lot across the street from the Council. By order of the Union Police Department, there is no curb parking in front of the Council. Also, parking is not allowed in the private lot of the furniture store.
- Parking in the driveway is RESTRICTED to designated Council members and handicapped persons who have PROPER HANDICAPPED LICENSE PLATES.
- 9. Fires are permitted in grills, hot charcoal must be disposed of in the receptacles provided. No chaining of grills to tables or trees at any time (fire hazards). Tanks and grills not off the premises by September 30th, will be disposed of.
- 10. Please keep off the front lawn and do not litter the Council property.
- 11. Please clean off picnic/or patio tables when finished. There is no reserving of picnic/or patio tables. Coolers are to be placed at a designated area.
- 12. There is no ball playing in the patio area. Wiffle bat and balls, and nerf equipment are allowed in the picnic area. Contact sports are not allowed.
- 13. NO PETS of any kind are allowed on Columbian Club property.
- 14. When using a recreational facilty, there is a 45 minutes time limit if someone is waiting to use the facilty(i.e. bocci or horseshoes). Rubber horseshoes must be used by children under 18 years of age.
- 15. All persons on Columbian Club property must wear shoes, sneakers or the equivalent at all times.
- 16. NO ONE UNDER 21 YEARS OF AGE is allowed in the bar area at any time.

Failure to comply with these rules and regulations shall be considered as cause for immediate suspension of Columbian Club privileges.

Furthermore, anyone suspended for not following the rules and regulations of the Swim Club will automatically lose Columbian Club privileges. Members will be notified of suspensions by the Grand Knight.

You must remember that no one person is assigned to prevent violations of rules and regulations. But each one of us has the RIGHT and RESPONSIBILITY to correct any offenders that we observe.
