UNION COUNCIL K OF C DEFENDS THE UNBORN

In an effort to help stem the American rate of abortion, Union Council 4505, Knights of Columbus, has donated \$1,000.00 to Several Sources of Ramsey, New Jersey. The Foundation was begun in 1982 by Kathy DiFiore to offer a haven and temporary shelter for homeless pregnant women. Several Sources seeks to save the lives of the unborn by offering a home, food and clothing, and compassionate love to those faces with this life or death decision.

The presentation was made Monday, May 11, by Grand Knight Thomas McGarvey, at the Council building. The money represented funds collected by the Knights from both Catholic parishes in Union, St. Michael's and Holy Spirit. Council Chaplain, Fr. Robert Fuhrman said, "Death is never the answer: Young people contemplating abortion must know that help is available so their babies can have a chance at life. This Council as a body, and we as individuals, are committed to the sanctity of life and the defense of the helpless unborn, and the protection of their mothers."

Ms. DiFiore comments, "We are here to assist. It is truly a joy to be able to share in this lifesaving work of God's innocent unborn."


