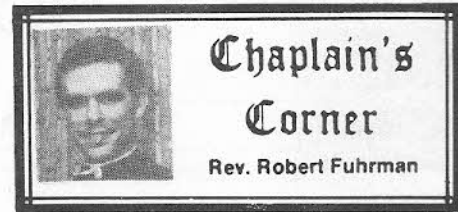

**OCTOBER FIRST FRIDAY**

Deacon Mark Earley will present a program on the first and greatest Eucharistic Miracle of the Catholic Church. This wondrous event took place in the Eighth Century in the little Church of Saint Legontain as a Divine Response to a Basilian Monk's doubt about Jesus' Real Presence in the Eucharist. During Holy Mass, after the two-fold consecration, the Host was changed into live flesh and the wine was changed into live blood. Since 1713 the flesh has been reserved in a silver Ostensorium and the blood is enclosed in a rich and very old cup made of rock crystal and both are displayed in a Church Sanctuary in Lanciano, Italy.

Come and hear the analyses of both species which were conducted by prominent scientists. This exciting program will amaze and remain with you forever. The program begins with Holy Mass at 7:30 P.M.

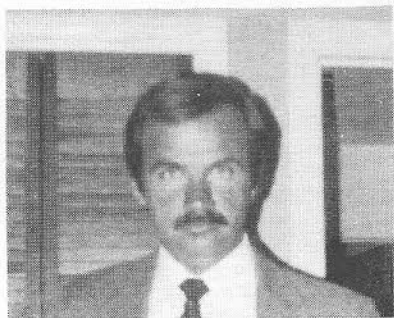
