One Nation Under God Ceremony Planned

A recent court decision has ruled that the words 'One Nation Under God' should be stricken from the Pledge of Allegiance. Since the Knights of Columbus led the battle to insert these words into the Pledge in 1954, we are taking a lead role in bringing this issue to the center of public attention. To that end, our Council has asked the Township of Union permission to arrange an assembly at Town Hall during which residents will be able to demonstrate their support for maintaining the Pledge as it is currently written. As part of the ceremony, we will be donating a pennant embossed with the words 'One Nation Under God' which will be flown under the United States flag at Town Hall.

This event is scheduled for Saturday, April 24th at 11:00 am. Local veterans groups, as well as the Boys and Girls Scouts will be invited to attend. Please mark your calendars to join us for this important event. For further information contact the Grand Knight Mike Cavallo at (908) 686-7540.

YANKEE TRIP TO TORONTO

We will be traveling to Toronto to attend a game at the world famous Skydome ballpark. We will depart on Saturday morning July 24th @ 8:00 am and return on Tuesday evening the 27th. We will travel via a luxury motor coach which will be stocked with snacks and soft drinks. We will stop for lunch along the way. The estimated travel time including a one-hour stop for lunch is 9 hours.

We will stay at the Skydome Renaissance hotel, which is connected to the ballpark. Our trip will include a tour of the facilities on Monday afternoon, an all you can eat prime rib buffet, and club level seats for the game on Monday evening. In addition to the game and tour, the hockey hall of fame is located within walking distance as well as the CN Tower. Toronto also boasts numerous restaurants and nightlife as well as a fantastic theater district all within walking distance of the hotel. The cost for transportation, tickets and refreshments to Toronto will be approximately \$140 per person.
