

#### A Precious Gift for the Sick by Friar Jeremy Harrington, OFM

February 11th was the 25th World Day of the Sick, the feast of Our Lady of Lourdes. Pope Francis encourages us to pray for the sick and their caregivers. I would like to mention one service to the sick that is sometimes neglected the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick.

Some may think of the anointing as only for those near death. It is important then, but the Church also recommends that the very ill or those having serious surgery be anointed. The Epistle of James asks, "Is anyone among you sick?" Call the priest who will "pray over him and anoint him with oil in the name of the Lord, and the prayer of faith will save the sick person, and the Lord will raise him up. If he has committed any sins, he will be forgiven" (James 5:14-15).

The Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick includes confession, if the person chooses, and a short Scripture reading. Then the priest, praying silently, puts his hands on the person's head. Then he anoints the person with the Oil of the Sick blessed by the bishop on Holy Thursday on the forehead with these words: "Through this holy anointing may the Lord in his love and mercy help you with the grace of the Holy Spirit." He anoints the palm of each hand saying, "May the Lord who frees you from sin save you and raise you up."

For those in danger of death, the priest adds special prayers. Most importantly, he gives them Holy Communion, called Viaticum, which is food for the journey to meet our Savior. Why is it important to receive the holy anointing? Pope Francis told people at a general audience: "Because it is Jesus who comes to lift up the sick person, to give him strength, to give hope, to help him, and to forgive his sins."

The anointing gives "strength, peace, and courage to overcome the difficulties that go with the condition of serious illness or the frailty of old age," the Catechism of the Catholic Church adds. It helps them renew their faith in God and to overcome discouragement that can come with sickness.

Another benefit, "union with the passion of Christ," may sound strange to people without faith. The anointing helps the sick understand the mystery that their suffering can be united with the suffering of Christ. Physical healing is not the main purpose of the sacrament, but it can happen if that is God's will. I know if I am seriously ill or all the more in danger of death, I want someone to call a priest. The Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick is a precious gift!
