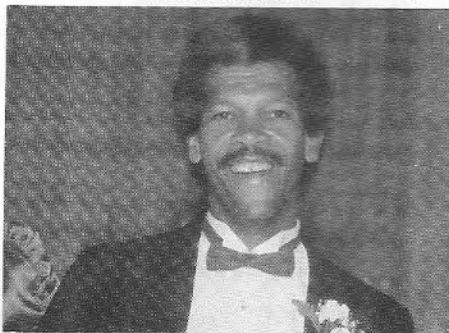

**"More Women Who Lose
Husbands End Up Poor!"**

The title of this article by Kim I Mills, Associated Press writer, has been a fact for many years because of the unforeseen needs in the future.

Too many people depend on their insurance from work, but the fact remains the same insurance at work will disappear when they need it most. "The number of women who spent years as homemakers then lost their husbands—and their primary source of income—rose by four million between 1980 and 1990, according to a report released yesterday." And far more of these women either end up in low-level service jobs or live in poverty than the population as a whole, concluded the report, which was based on Census Bureau data.
