The greatest feast in the Christian calendar is the feast of Easter. If there were no resurrection, life would really be unfair. But because there









Grand Knight's Column

This month we celebrate Easter, the most important Christian Festival of the year. We associate Easter with Eternal life, believing in the resurrection of



Jesus Christ and our own new life after death.

Easter is associated with many symbols. The crucifix with an image of Jesus' body symbolizes the sacrifice Jesus made by allowing Himself to be killed. An empty cross reminds us of Jesus' victory over death and the new life to be given to those who are His followers.

Candles represent the spreading of Jesus' light throughout the world. We celebrate birthdays with candles on the cake which again indicates the celebration of life.

Lilies are used to decorate churches and homes. The large ore white blossoms remind Christians of the pure new life we receive through the resurrection of Jesus.

The lamb is another important Easter symbol. It represents Jesus and relates His death to that of the lamb sacrificed on the first Passover. We also refer to Jesus as "The Lamb of God".

Eggs and rabbits are the most familiar symbols in our homes. Eggs representing new life is associated with Easter because of its renewal of life. Rabbits are associated with the fertility of spring because of their ability to produce so many young. In our world today, we often view the Easter holiday as "The Easter Bunny" brings eggs.

Wearing new clothes for Easter is a custom which originated from the old practice of having newly baptized Christians wear new white clothes on Easter. Like many other Easter symbols, the new clothes represent the new life offered through the death and resurrections of Jesus.

No matter how we use these symbols in our daily living, let us remember the truly important aspect of Easter, Jesus is Risen, Alleluia.
