# **Knights of Columbus License Plates**

As a non-profit service organization, the Knights of Columbus is eligible to participate in the New Jersey Organizational Special (License) Plate Program offered by the Division of Motor Vehicle Services (MVS).

The design will be similar to the line drawing shown

below.



There is a one-time fee of \$25.00, and the plates are transferable if you change cars in the future.

A few simple but definite MVS rules must be observed:

- THE VEHICLE MUST BE REGISTERED IN THE MEM-BER'S NAME. (No Company or Spouse-owned cars are eligible).
- 2. THE APPLICANT MUST BE A PAID-UP ACTIVE MEMBER.
- PLATES ARE NOT AVAILABLE WITH OTHER SYMBOLS, ie.: HANDICAPPED, FIRST-AIDER, etc., and MOTORCYCLE PLATES ARE NOT AVAILABLE. To order one or more sets of plates:
- Obtain a photostat of your VEHICLE REGISTRATION.
- Obtain a photostat of your current MEMBERSHIP CARD.
- Write a CHECK or MONEY ORDER for \$25.00 for each set ordered, payable to:

November, the month of All Saints and All Souls, is the time of year when the Church turns its attention to the Last Things: Heaven, Hell, Purgatory, Death, and Judgement.

How many times have you heard people say, especially in times of great suffering: "I don't believe there's a Hell after you die; I believe it's Hell right here on earth!". How many times have you said it? No matter how many times you've heard it, no matter how many times you've said it, it's WRONG! If Hell is right here on earth it's a Hell of our own making: it means that we've shut God out of our sufferings, it means that we deny that He cares enough to be with us in our need. Hell is separation from God: suffering in this world borne with faith, hope, and love draws us into the Heart of God- 'Jesus said to his disciples, "Whoever wishes to come after me must deny himself, take up his cross, and follow me". (Matthew 16:24) As we bear our crosses of suffering, of disappointment, of weakness we walk in the way of the Lord. There is nowhere that we bear our crosses that He has not borne His before us.

I do not mean to make light of suffering. Bearing one's cross is never easy: that's why it's a cross. But this often difficult and burdensome way we walk is not the road to nowhere, not is it a journey without meaning. It is the way to Heaven, indeed the only way to Heaven: it's the way of


#### **GOLF OUTING**
