BELIEVE IN YOURSELF

Back during the first half of the eighteenth century, there was a young boy who aspired to be a writer. Because of his lack of formal education, the boy wasn't sure of his ability. And his life had not been one that would foster self-confidence. His family had moved quite often, his father finally being jailed because of his inability to pay his debts. Because of the circumstances, this young boy had been able to attend school for only four years.

To earn a living he got a job putting labels on bottles of blacking in a dilapidated warehouse. He found a dismal attic in which to sleep, and he shared that room with others who couldn't afford anything better.

But this young boy was determined to write. He did write. Day after day. Finally he got enough courage to submit a manuscript to a publisher. He mailed that manuscript at night, when no one could see him because he was afraid someone might ridicule him. Soon he heard from the publisher. His manuscript was refused.

Time and time again he submitted writings. Again and again the same answer came back—rejected. No publisher or paper was interested in his writings. But the desire to write was burning in the young boy's heart and he refused to quit.

Finally, one of his stories was accepted. He didn't receive any money for the story, but the editor did give him some praise. It was such a happy moment for him that he

walked the streets with tears of joy coming down his cheeks. Now someone else had shown some belief in him

This bit of encouragement gave that young boy the impetus he needed to go on to greater things. And in a few years all of England was reading his writings. The young boy believed in himself, believed he was capable of reaching the dream he had for himself in his heart. For that reason, he would not quit.

Too often in life we quit too soon. Many times the victory is just around the corner if we would only keep trying.

It is of great importance that a person believe in himself. Selling ourselves short is no virtue. It is a vice. It hurts us. It keeps us from developing our God-given resources to become all that we can become—all that God wants us to become.

The dreams we have for ourselves—of what we can do and become—can come true. They can, that is, if we are willing to continue to work toward the fulfillment of those dreams with all the resources we have. But we must remember that the fulfillment of any dream requires dedication, sacrifice, and persistence on our part.

The young boy in London who refused to quit was Charles Dickens. His novels are still read to this day. He believed in himself.

Believe in yourself. God does.

BY-LAWS—CHANGES

1. Article III

Management

Board of Trustees

ADD

2. Article IV

Section 2C

ADD

Term of trustee shall be elected for a term of two years. There shall be two trustees.

3. Article V

Section 2B

(Changes) ADD

The second Vice-President shall accept and fulfill the duties of kitchen manager of this Columbian Club.

4. Article V

Section 5

(Changes) ADD

The Auditing Committee shall consist of four (4) members of the Columbian Club, who shall be appointed by the President of the Columbian Club, at the end of each annual period. The Auditing Committee shall meet and audit the books of the Columbian Club. and shall at the first regular business meeting in February, make a full report of their findings, including the receipts and disbursements of the monies of this Columbian Club for the annual period, the balance on hand of each of the various funds at the end of the annual period, and the assets and liabilities of this Columbian Club. Such meetings of the Auditing Committee shall be held in January of each year. (Delete July of each year).

5. Article VI

Section 1

(Delete)

Except that the annual meeting for the adoption of these by-laws shall be held the fourth Monday in March, 1976

6. Article VIII

No expenditure for capital improvement shall be voted by the Board of Directors of the Columbian Club which shall exceed the sum of \$5,000
