1987 SUMMER RULES AND REGULATIONS

The Patio Area, Snack Bar, patio Bar and Picnic Area are for the benefit of **ALL** members of Union Council 4504 and their families. These areas are the direct responsibility of the Columbian Club. Since March, Council members have been giving up their time and talents every week to make these areas a showplace and not a source of embarrassment. In order to keep these areas aesthetic and safe, your cooperation is imperative! We are taking this opportunity to remind you of some of the rules and regulations.

1. **NO ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES** are to be brought on or off the Patio Area, Picnic Area, Clubhouse, etc.

2. The laboratories, Patio and Picnic areas are cleaned each morning. During the day it is a **cooperative effort** to keep them clean.

3. After 9:30 p.m., children under 16 years of age are permitted **WITH** their parent or guardian.

4. Please respect the privacy and property of our neighbors.

5. The cost of any property damage (especially for vandalism) will be charged to the responsible member.

6. Bicycles and mopeds must be parked in designated areas. There is no bicycle, moped riding or skateboard use in Patio, Picnic Areas and Driveway.

7. Parking is restricted to the free, public parking lot across the street from the Council.

8. By order of the Union Police Department, there is no curb parking on the street in front of the Council. Also, parking is not allowed in the parking lot of the furniture store.

9. Parking in the driveway is **RESTRICTED**. Violators may have their car towed away.

10. Fires are permitted in grills - hot charcoal must be disposed of in the receptacles provided.

11. Please keep off the front lawn and do not litter the driveway or in front of the Council home.

12. Please clean off picnic tables when finished.

13. There is no ball playing in the Patio Area. Hitting a ball, with a stick or bat, is forbidden in the Picnic Area.

Failure to comply with these rules and regulations shall be considered as cause for immediate suspension of Columbian Club privileges. Furthermore, anyone suspended for not following the rules and regulations of the Swim Club will automatically lose Columbian Club privileges. Parents will be notified of suspensions by the Grand Knight.

You must remember that no one person is assigned to prevent violations of rules and regulations. But each one of us has the **RIGHT** and **RESPONSIBILITY** to correct any offenders that we observe.

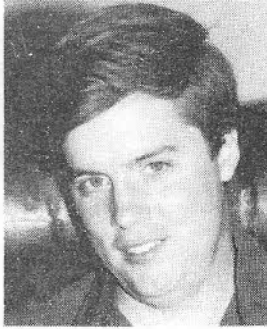

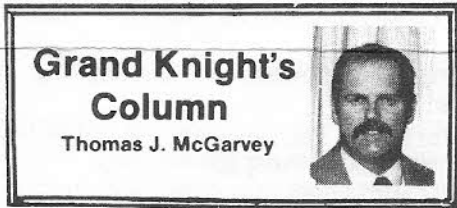
Marriage is a Sacrament

Just a few days ago (April 25), great joy filled St. Michael's Church and this Council as Deputy Grand Knight Paul Sandy and his beautiful bride, Karen Scarlato, exchanged the vows of marriage. I had the privilege of blessing their marriage, at which so many family members and friends were present. The celebration that followed was also a festive and joyful one. Paul and Karen are well known to everyone at the Council and on behalf of all Knights of this Council, I congratulate them and sincerely wish them all of God's blessings.

Marriage, like everything else of value, is a challenging enterprise. The Catholic Church defends the gospel and the words of Christ. That is why a sacramental marriage is indissoluble. Perhaps you have heard of the Church's Pre-Cana program of marriage preparation. The name come from the place where Jesus worked his first miracle - at a wedding in Cana of Galilee. There is preparation required before every sacrament, and marriage is no exception. There is no more serious decision which a person can make on earth than whom their partner will be through life. The Pre-Cana sessions are meant to help couples approach marriage realistically and joyfully, aware of the realities which they will face in a difficult world. There are normally three sessions in a Pre-Cana, run by a team of married couples and a priest. I have found this work extremely gratifying in the past five years at St. Michael's. We have a successful program because of the quality of our team couples. There is time for talking and thinking, praying and socializing. A Pre-Cana is not in any way a test or a sensitivity session. No couple is forced to say anything. The goal is to get a couple discussing certain topics in depth with each other. The topics could be summarized as these: Communication in marriage, sexuality, and finances.

Remember, this program or one like it is required by the bishops, and with good reason. The U.S. has the highest divorce rate in the world, almost 50%. And marriage is a sacrament, which of course is meant by God to be forever. Please give a good attitude to your sons or daughters or friends who tell you they have to do a Pre-Cana. It can be a precious aid to a permanently happy marriage. Congratulations again to Paul and Karen and to all who marry this year. May the Holy Family, Jesus, Mary, and Joseph protect you.


