CHRISTMASREFLECTION

When your Grand Knight asked me if I would compose a reflection for this issue, it was in the middle of November, six weeks before Christmas. I wasn't even in the mood for reflecting on Advent yet—or even on Thanksgiving. I was more concerned about getting our newly renovated church building open and getting all the glitches out of new sound and lighting systems, maintenance problems, etc. Christmas was six long weeks away.


