

Since leaving school I have been a Parochial Vicar at St. Aloyius, Jersey City, St. Ann's in Newark, Sacred Heart in Lyndhurst, Most Blessed Sacrament, in Frankline Lakes, and Sacred Heart in Bloomfield. I have previously served as pastor of St. Joseph's in Bayonne, and St. James in Springfield. While in Springfield I had a short term as chaplain to the Springfield Council. I am the present pastor of St. Paul the Apostle in Irvington since 1989. I am honored to have been asked to be
