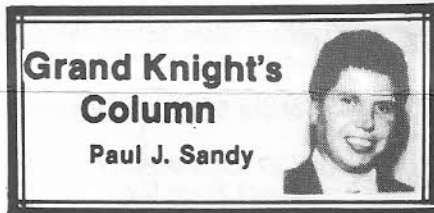

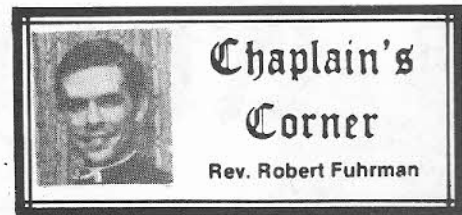
Please remember that our Council Awards Dinner and the drawing for our last charitable raffle for this calendar year will be held on June 27. I hope to see all of you there.

The loss of electricity left Sacred Heart Cathedral in darkness.

I was scheduled to offer the 5:30 Mass in the Cathedral and found the chapel as dark as night. I offered Mass with only candlelight and a few people. It made me think of the Church under persecution when, centuries ago Mass was celebrated in the catacombs, underground and in the dark. It was certainly better to have a dark chapel than a dark heart and soul, and real Catholics know that it is the sacrifice of Christ at Mass which brings us true light and comfort.

The late afternoon thunderstorms are a sign of summer approaching. I wish to encourage all brother Knights and their families to relax and be with each other, to slow the pace a bit, and to realize just how much God has given us, especially in the sacraments.

Also, as summer arrives, I salute our outgoing Grand Knight Paul Sandy. As we all knew he would, Paul has continued the long and fine tradition of Union Council's Grand Knights and done a fine job. At the same time, I welcome our new Grand Knight Mike Carr and all the officers.

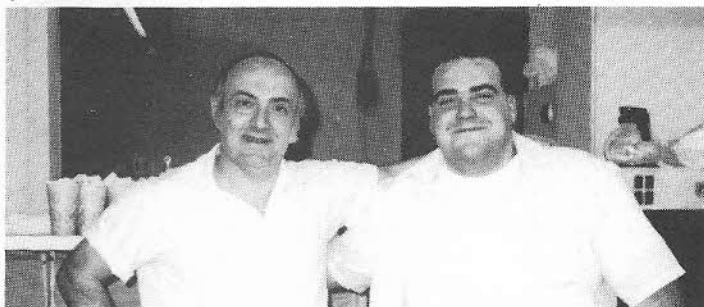
