Back then we were limited to 10 guests per season with a card that had to be punched indicating how many guest visits were remaining. The children were lined up at the gate waiting for the pool to open, and they all would challenge each other as to who would be the first in the pool. Years ago we had a diving board; but with increased insurance costs, it became too prohibitive to maintain.

Most of the families stayed at the pool and cooked dinner on the grills in the grove area, and then they either attended swim meets or just played with the kids. The parents had a good time socializing, as well as the children. Many families were there from morning until it became dark. The night time splash parties were a big hit for the children; then adult swim parties came along and were great as well.

Before I was a member and after I became a member of the pool, I attended as many work parties as I could for the work party pool passes. There was a sign-in sheet for the volunteers, and for years we had four to five full pages with names. Today, there are perhaps five to ten names on the volunteer sheet. I realize there are a lot of reasons why people can't attend, but the work only gets done by members volunteering.

When I became membership director, we had 350 families who were members of the pool; today, we have a little over 200. Why has membership declined? There are many reasons and not one single is predominant over the other. But one thing is for certain: if we don't increase membership, we may not have a pool.
