

## Chaplain's Corner

Rev. Methodius Kushko

Recently I had received a letter of gratitude from Dr. Fred Schwartz, President of the Christian Anti-Communist Crusade of United States. His message was brief but concise. he felt that negotiating with the Soviet communists will be one of the heavy responsibilities facing President Reagan. The press will be hounding him to produce swift positive results. "We pray that God will give the President wisdom and patient strength and that other world leaders may understand the problems created by the nature of the Communists. They regard diplomacy as a battle in the universal class war which they awre confident that they will win. Communism must be studied, exposed and defeated.'

In discussions which take place in our K of C chambers, I am amazed how some brother Knights are unaware as to what is the nature of communism and who are the Communists. And yet we Catholics need to know who are our enemies in this global spiritual warfare that we are waging. There is a spiritual warfare going on and one of the leaders is Satan. Yet we can see if we are not blinded to the reality that is before us as portrayed through the TV media.

We do see that President Reagan is being hounded by the press, the academy and misinformed politicians to achieve the impossible in his negotiations with the communists. They should heed the recent official statement made by the leaders of the Soviet Union:

"All sensible politicians realize very well that the historical dispute between socialism and capitalism is not being resolved at the table of diplomatic negotiations between states belonging to the two different social systems. It is being resolved in the course of the global class struggle, in the course of the ideological contest."

I feel that we must win the ideological contest by proclaiming the truth about communism and freedom to the entire world. Yet we cannot dismiss the forewarning given to us by the late Archbishop Fulton Sheen when he said, "If you don't believe in the existence of the devil, then you won't understand the Communist system."

To be informed well, read a short book. "You Can Trust the Communists to be Communists" by Dr. Fred Schwartz. I can obtain a copy for you.


### Yankee Bus Trip
