On, November 30, 1997 Union Council lost one of its' most dedicated member. Frank Dickerson was the embodiment of the principles of our order; a true Catholic Gentleman.

Frank became a First Degree Member of Father Canty Council in Hillside on October 13, 1957. He became a charter member of our Council when it was formed on December 2, 1957 and immediately became active as the first Council Athletic Chairman. Frank ran the first Council bus trip to Yankee Stadium and also organized Council basketball and softball teams. Over the next seven years Frank stayed quite busy organizing various events and dances, while progressing through the Chairs. Frank became the seventh Grand Knight of Union Council for the 1964-1965 Columbian Year. Frank was next selected to serve the State Council as District Deputy.

In 1970, Frank was appointed to the position of Financial Secretary of our Council by the Supreme Council in New Haven. Frank held this position with distinction for twenty seven years.

We have lost an exemplary member and a dear friend. We share the loss with his wife Mary and their children and we also thank them for their generosity in sharing Frank with us for the past forty years.
