
# Grand Knight's Column

### Religion and Politics: THE HIDDEN PERIL

A few keen politicians are watching and waiting to see if the promises made were intended to be kept after the election or only until election day. But, there is one election result that has been clear to me for quite some time: the way in which the red hot issue of religion and politics was debated. Let me not be a prophet of doom, but the way religion and politics was debated poses grave concerns for the future of the church in America.

According to most polls, the public resented the issue "religion and politics." That's not surprising, I suppose, considering the projection of fear in the daily news headlines. Some hand-wringing alarmists warned of "religious ayatollahs," and others suggested the formation of a state-established religion.'
