

Chaplain's Column Rev. Edward Gedrich

"Angel of God, my guardian dear, to whom God's love commits me here, ever this day be at my side, to light and guard, to rule and quide."

I first learned this prayer in first or second grade CCD. I have said it upon waking most days since. Many of those days, the days of my life, have brought me joy. Some have brought deep sadness. But through the joys and through the sorrows this prayer has been a constant expression of trust in God's providential care.

It is a simple prayer and, in its rhyme, a child-like prayer, but did not Jesus say: "I assure you, unless you change and become like little children, you will not enter the kingdom of God" (Mt18:3). He call us not to childishness, to spoiled displays of temper, but rather to child-like-ness, to lives of innocent trust.

It would be impossible for those of us "getting on in years" to regain lost innocence: we have seen too much. But it is indeed possible for us to trust - indeed, it is essential that we trust. A life without trust is narrow and self-protecting and dark, imprisoning us in a threatening world, whereas trust sets us free to embrace opportunities God gives us in this world graced by His love.

The Feast of the Guardian Angels, celebrated October 2nd, expresses the Church's conviction, borne of faith, that God has created noncorporeal (unbodied) loving spiritual beings to accompany us on our life's journey as messengers of His abiding love. We cannot see them, but our trust in their caring presence expresses our faith that God works through all that is, seen and unseen, to bring us blessings, to lead us to the endless joy of His Kingdom.
