

Next Monday, January 23, the church bells of St. Michael's will toll twenty-three times after the Angelus bells at noon and again at 6 P.M.. Other churches all over our nation will do the same — in memory of the twenty-three million(!!) babies whose lives have been ended through abortion since the Supreme Court's tragic decision in 1973.

We may be against abortion — but are we for life? Are we for the support of the child of an unwed mother? Are we for the gentle and supportive counseling of a scared teenager? Are we for the healing of women whose bodies and spirits have already known the trauma of abortion? Do we truly treasure every human life that crosses our path, regardless of its usefulness to us?

Remember for whom the bell tolls. It tolls for us.
