# Retarded Citizens Drive Reaches \$11,350

The Annual Retarded Citizens Drive held in April grossed a record amount of \$11,350 far exceeding any prior drive in Council history. The drive was well organized and planned by our co-chairmen John Boyle III, Ray Fluet and Don Wolfe. In addition to a record sum of money, this year's drive also produced a record number of collectors and counters and a record individual collection of over \$700 by Wayne Wegner.

The canister collections on the various corners and at the local churches amounted to \$8795. The collection from the local business community amounted to \$1465 and the response from the members netted an additional \$1090 from approximate-

ly 100 brothers.
