



Chaplain's Column

Fasting and prayer. The two are joined in Christian spirituality following the counsel of Our Lord, who in Matthew's Gospel told his disciples of the power of prayer and fasting to cast out evil, and who Himself fasted and prayed for forty days in the desert.

Fasting and prayer. Most of us find it easy to pray most of the time. I suspect all of us find it difficult to fast at all. Our society is one in which we are taught that our desires ought to be gratified instantaneously: our refrigerators and pantries are stocked with our favorite foods, entertainment is only a remote control away. No wonder fasting doesn't come easy. We need added incentive if we are to fast at all.

We are in the midst of the holy season of Lent, a time of self-discipline and renewal. Our nation is at war, and our prayer is for peace. Perhaps these two, taken together, might move us to follow Jesus' example and counsel to fast and to pray. Let us fast, let us deny ourselves, not just for our own sakes, but for the sake of peace, for the sake of the men and women in the Gulf who bear the burden and sacrifice of battle.

When we undertake a spiritual commitment for our own personal good alone, we can rationalize away our failure to follow through in our good intentions: "I'm only humani" But when we take upon ourselves a commitment to sacrifice for others, we are strengthened by our determination to not let them down, and to not betray the better angels of our nature.

So in the remaining weeks of Lent, fast and pray for peace. Gain strength from the sacrifices others make for you in a land far from home.
