Chaplain's Column




On November 16, 1989, in the war ravaged country of San Salvador, and additional tragedy was committed by members of their

military when six Jesuit priests, their housekeeper and her young daughter were taken from their residence and summarily executed. No political revolution was being planned by these martyrs, no acts of terrorism. Their fault, if it can be described as such, was being Christian presence of goodness in a society that had grown numb to goodness. When goodness confronts any society, there are three basic reactions, the first reaction and the most laudable is to see one's life is in need of reform and conversion and to turn to the Lord for the strength to make that conversion. The second reaction is to run from the goodness so that it does no discomfort us. The third reaction is to try to destroy the witnesses of the goodness as if, by so doing, the goodness itself would be destroyed. Sadly, the third reaction was the one adopted in San Salvador on that night in November.

That we would be asked to witness to Jesus Christ in the heroic way of the martyrs just described is a remote possibility. But witness is an integral part of the meaning of Christian. Ours is not simply a comtemplative or meditative relationship with the Lord but is also one that is described in the New Testament as being "....doers of the word," not simply hearers of the word. Let us examine our lives to see how well we witness. Do we react to goodness in that first way? Do we influence the lives of those close to us so intensely that they can see goodness and imitate it? Do we make our membership in the fraternity of the Knights a vehicle for the demonstration of good? Do we look for ways to go the extra distance to spread the good news of the

Knights of Columbus Seek 'Decency in Media'

In a resolution passed at the Knights of Columbus' 110th national convention held in New York City on August 4, the Knights assailed "the proliferation of exploitative treatments of sex and violence in the media, along with their. frequent, and apparently deliberate assaults on the values and beliefs of Catholics and persons of other religious traditions."

The resolutions asked those responsible for setting media policy to re-examine their pratices, and take steps to protect the public interest by voluntarily eliminating material of this kind.

The resolution further urged courts and law enforcement officials vigorously to enforce existing laws against obscenity.

The Knights of Columbus, whose membership today totals 1,525,426, pledged continued support for Morality in Media and other organizations fighting for the preservation and enhancement of family values.
