MESSAGE FROM THE GRAND KNIGHT

Brother Knights at Union Council 4504,

As I stated in my January Grand Knight's message, the second half of this Columbian Year I would like all of us to focus on getting involved at our Council. The best way to get involved is to get involved with us by attending meetings. Every month Supreme sends each Grand Knight a Membership statement, and according to my December 31, 2013 statement Council 4504 has a total membership of 1,333 Brother Knights. So why is it we only get 30 - 35 Brothers at our Council meetings? This is less than 3 % of our membership. And worse of these 30 - 35 Brothers, 13 are Officers so we actually only get 20 Brothers attending. So this brings the percentage down to 1 1/2%. We as a Council cannot function and do the good works as Knights of Columbus without every Brother's help.

This point was made clear to me recently after Mass one Sunday, when a Brother Knight at our Council whom we each recognized each other as Brother Knights at the Union Knights asked me if I had been up to the Council lately. My reply was yes, that I had to go there since I was the current Grand Knight. After we shared a laugh, we briefly talked about how great the Council building was looking now after the hard work of everyone this past summer. While my personal ego was not hurt that he did not know that I was the current Grand Knight, my ego as the Grand Knight was bruised in the fact that he did not recognize me as the current Grand Knight. Since he did not recognize me as the current Grand Knight, he must not have been to a meeting in over a year and a half. As Grand Knight for the past six months and as Deputy Grand Knight last year, I was at all meetings, and was also very active in the years before that as I came up the chairs in the other officers positions.

I know that we all have very busy lives and schedules, but is it too much to ask that you take some time to get involved with the organization that you thought was important enough to join, and make the Degrees to become a member of? Our meetings are twice a month on the second and fourth Mondays. Once a month we hold a Family Dinner on the third Thursday each month. We do various Charitable functions all year such as our Food Drives and collections for our Intellectual Disabilities Drive that we need help at. We hold various social events for our members and families too, that you and your family can come to and enjoy themselves with your fellow Brother Knights and their families.

I would like to ask that each Brother Knight that reads this message make a commitment to himself and our Council to come out and attend more meetings and events and help the Union Council to grow, not just in number of members, but grow as a Council through good works and actions in our Parishes and community.

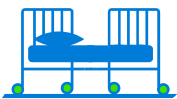


Fund Raising with TD Bank

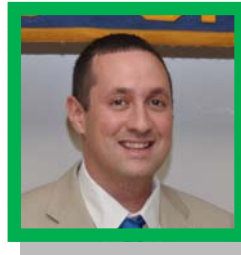

Membership in the Fourth degree does involve the payment of nominal annual dues that are used to support the needs of the Assembly. Meetings of the Assembly take place in our Council home on the 4th Wednesday of every month.

Charity, Unity, and Fraternity

Charity, Unity, and Fraternity are the core Principles of the Third Degree, and while we as Knights try to practice them regularly we seldom get the opportunity to do so all at the same time.

Recently the family of a Brother Knight who suffered a stroke a short time ago contacted Jim Feehan to see if the Union Knights could help him in his purchase of a motorized wheelchair. The \$2,500 cost was prohibitive to him and they were looking for some financial help for him. Jim knowing this Brother Knight's past commitment to our Council, his service to our Columbian Club, and his having served as a past Columbian Club President, came to an Officers meeting to present this request on his behalf. After a brief discussion it was unanimously agreed to present a motion on the floor of the next Council meeting to give this Brother Knight \$1,000 towards the purchase of a motorized wheelchair.

At the next Council meeting a motion was put on the floor and was passed to donate the \$1,000 for the wheelchair. This matter could have ended here with just writing a check, but Rich Liput, knowing of a person who reconditions pre-owned motorized wheelchairs started looking into getting one at a cost lower than the \$2,500 for a new one, so this Brother Knight and his family did not have the burden of coming up with the \$1,500 balance needed. Rich's contact did have a practically brand new motorized wheelchair that would work for this Brother Knight needs and the cost was within the \$1,000 donated from our Council.

Next came getting this wheelchair to the Brother Knight, and Jim, and Rich, along with Gary Hornig, Mike Carr, and Joe Marateo went with a pickup truck to pick it up and deliver it to the nursing home where this Brother Knight was at.

Words could not describe the joy this Brother Knight had when these Brother Knights delivered his wheelchair to him. And the great feeling it gave to these Brother Knights knowing the difference they made in his life.

Charity, Unity, and Fraternity, three words that when practiced can make the world of difference in someone life. Whether on the receiving or giving end.

Thank you to these Brother Knights who stepped up and showed what it means to be Knights of Columbus.
