

Chaplain's Corner An "American" Pope

As I write this month's column, our Holy Father is in the middle of his American tour. He has already visited Florida, South Carolina, Louisiana, and Texas. By the time you read these words, God willing, Pope John Paul will be resting from a successful trip, back in Rome. But for now, John Paul II is an American, at least in an honorary way.

How do we judge the success of such a trip? In many ways. The Pope is not just another priest or bishop. He comes to us as an authoritative teacher. The Pope is the Vicar of Christ, enjoying the very same authority that Jesus gave to St. Peter (cf. Mt. 16). Therefore, we listen to him. We defend him from the enemies of the Church, and there are plenty of them.

Pope John Paul will have had a successful trip if he makes all Americans think about God and the Church, about goodness and evil. May the Church in America always be loyal, and informed about our Faith. We are a great Church, but we still have a lot to learn. There is no better teacher on earth than the one given to us by God for that apostolic office. Pope John Paul. No make-believe theologian or controversial university professor can compare with him. Remember, we are Roman Catholics. All the media reports about the confusion and lack of unity in the American church indicated that there are some problems present. But the problems are with those who dissent, not with those who teach Catholic doctrine.

It seems to me that Pope John Paul has once again done what no one else in the world can do as well. He has stymied the media, which in many ways is anti-Catholic. He is admired and loved by all people of good will. The reporters will really have to dig to find valid criticism; I haven't heard any yet. And if the Holy Father suffers for preaching the truth (for example, the importance of the sacraments, charity, chastity, etc.) then I suspect he will gladly suffer. He has more than done his part.

We should always thank God for such a courageous and Christ-like Pope. He has the fortitude to tell us what we are doing right - and wrong - and he has the love and gentleness to play with children and laugh with them. Look at Pope John Paul. You will see Jesus Christ in action!
