Have you considered *giving the gift of life*, but never have? In addition to the fact that *donating blood is completely safe*, here are ten more facts about giving blood that might prompt you to attend this important function. *Let's make this year a banner year for blood donation from Union Council 4504*.

- > Just one pint of donated blood can help save up to three lives.
- > Red blood cells must be used within forty-two days and there is no substitute for human blood.
- ➤ Every ten seconds, someone in the United States receives a blood transfusion.
- > If you began donating blood at age seventeen and donated every fifty-six days until you reached seventy-six, you would have donated forty-eight gallons.
- About three gallons of blood supports the entire nation's blood needs for one minute.
- Every three seconds someone needs blood.
- > One out of every four people in a hospital needs blood.
- > The average red blood cell transfusion is 3.4 pints.
- ➤ Sixty percent of the US population is eligible to donate only 5% do on a yearly basis.
- Ninety-four percent of all donors are registered voters. For more information about donating blood, call the Blood Center of New Jersey at 973-676-0547.
