A MESSAGE TO MY BROTHER KNIGHTS

The following article was written by a member in New Jersey. He wrote to alert his fellow brothers to buy life insurance today.

I would like to share my thoughts with my fellow Knights on the subject of proper insurance coverage before problems occur that would limit or prohibit adequate protection for one's family.

As a young lad, I really never gave much thought to planning for insurance coverage because I always felt that I was healthy and would always be able to work. Death never entered my mind. This thought was valid until my 55th birthday. At that time, I suffered a major heart attack requiring by-pass surgery. That was followed by pleural effusion and more surgery which resulted in extensive nerve damage to the left side of my body. The result was long term disability (LTD) causing me to leave a well-paying position in a company that I worked for over 39 years.

My goals for retiring were no longer valid.

The financial portfolio did not hold. Retirement benefits were now changed. Insurance coverage was inadequate and my family would be in deep trouble if I died. I called upon my Knights of Columbus agent to help me establish a plan that would protect my family.

I am now a 63 year old male with a history of heart disease, disabled and no longer a candidate for insurance coverage. Fortunately, my agent was able to set up a portfolio that would give my family protection, but it was not without great financial cost. If I had done proper planning during my younger days, the cost impact I now face would not be there.
