## **RETARDED CITIZENS DRIVE REACHES \$12,736**

The Annual Retarded Citizens Drive held in April grossed a record amount of \$12,736 exceeding any prior drive in Council history. The drive was well organized and planned by our co-chairmen John Boyle III, Bill Smela and Mike Kramer. In addition a record sum of money, this year's drive also produced a record number of collectors and counters. All of this was accomplished despite record torrential rains which fell on Sunday.

The canister collections on the various corners and at the local churches amounted to \$9513. The collection from the local business community amounted to \$1440, and the response from the members netted an additional \$1783 from approximately 140 brothers.

Have you ever seen the Off-Broadway musical "The Fantasticks"? It opened in the late Fifties at the Sullivan Street Playhouse in New York and is still running over thirty years later. It was the first play I ever saw, back when I was in grammar school. It's best known for its classic cong "Try to Remember": "Try to remember the kind of September when life was slow and oh so mellow.... Try to remember when life was so tender that no one wept except the willow..."

Well life's pace has quickened considerably for me since that grammar school September; I've done my share of weeping too -- haven't we all? But it is good to remember September's freshness, September's promise of new beginnings. As "Try to Remember" goes on: "Deep in December it's nice to remember without a hurt the heart is hollow ... 'December comes in every life, often again and again: times of loss and sorrow, time of confusion and doubt. It is good to remember that the hurts, meaningless and cruel as they so often seem, are not borne in vain: they can with God's help, hollow out our hearts for loving, for forgiving, for consoling.


