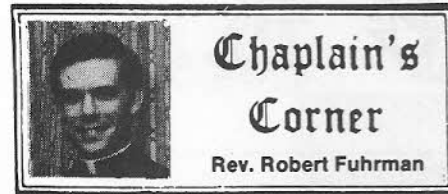

Convention Follies

The annual statewide Knights convention was held May 15-17 in Wildwood, N.J., down at the southern tip of our state. This was my first convention and an enjoyable one at that. Deputy Grand Knight Paul Sandy did a typically excellent job with all that was required for organizing our stay.

I have emerged from the convention with more pride than ever in Union Council 4504. However, as the largest council in the state, and with so many activities, I suspect that we intimidate some other councils and some elected authorities. An upsetting but fascinating scene was played out on Saturday, as the State officers dodged our council's resolution to help support the new Catholic chapel at Newark International Airport. Our proposal was termed "out of order." Grand Knight Tom McGarvey was eloquent, tactful, and forceful as he made repeated appeals, but the decision stood. There would be no donation to the chapel. Former council chaplain Fr. Ed Swierzbinski and myself both rose to speak from the floor in defense and support of our resolution, hoping to sway the tide of opinion. I think Fr. McGivney, the founder of the K of C, flipped in his coffin when two of his brother priests, Fr. Ed and me, were refused permission to speak because we were not official delegates! After being set down before hundreds of attendees, we proceeded to slink back to our seats, wondering about that "esteem for priests" concept. A hurried vote was taken, and the answer from the wor-thies was the same as it was last year: no!

Now, I can fully appreciate parliamentary procedure, but in the course of the same meeting, time was found for silly parades, where grown men wearing garbage bags pretended to be raisins, and another wore a gorilla outfit, all of them celebrating the "election" of state officers, none of whom were opposed. Strange going on indeed.

To me, and to this council, having the Holy Eucharist present at a major international airport is a worth while effort which deserves all forms of support by believing people. It is a spiritual endeavor which is totally Catholic. It makes me very proud to know that we will do it ourselves, without state council help. Union Council will continue to help support that little holy place in Terminal B. I am grateful to all who support this, especially our Grand Knight, who is completing a magnificent term of office. May this incident remind us all of the priority of our Catholicism in our lives and families. For Knights, for every Catholic, faith and its practice are vital.
