



At the first meeting in February 1958, Brother Pete Fresulone donated a locker for the Council's use and Tom Drogan donated the Beggars Bowl (which incidentally is still in use by the Lecturer to help defray the cost of refreshments at our meeting). The proceeds of the Beggars Bowl was donated to the Cerebal Palsy Drive. This became our method of raising funds for charitable causes in the early days. Members donated according to their means, depositing their donation in the Beggars Bowl at each meeting.
